### East of England Agricultural Society Meaning of "Society"

- Philosopher Thomas Hobbes believed that without society, human life would be "nasty, brutish and short." Man's natural state, he argued, would be to preserve only oneself a man without society would steal another family's food, seduce other men's wives and kill anyone who got in his way. Of course, the same man would be in constant danger of those things happening to him, his wife and his children.
- "Individual commitment to a group effort that is what makes a team work, a company work, a society work, a civilization work." Vince Lombardi
- "No matter the size, and no matter the link that binds a society together, be it religious, geographic, professional or economic, society is shaped by the relationships between individuals."

#### East of England Agricultural Society Charities Act 13 Description of Purposes

- (a) the prevention or relief of poverty
- (b) the advancement of education
- (c) the advancement of religion
- (d) the advancement of health or the saving of lives
- (e) the advancement of citizenship or community development
- (f) the advancement of the arts, culture, heritage or science
- (g) the advancement of amateur sport
- (h) the advancement of human rights, conflict resolution or reconciliation or the promotion of religious or racial harmony or equality and diversity
- (i) the advancement of environmental protection or improvement
- (j) the relief of those in need, by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage
- (k) the advancement of animal welfare
- (l) the promotion of the efficiency of the armed forces of the Crown, or of the efficiency of the police, fire and rescue services or ambulance services
- (m) any other purposes currently recognised as charitable or which can be recognised as charitable by analogy to, or within the spirit of, purposes falling within (a) to (l) or any other purpose recognised as charitable under the law of England and Wales

- ▶ 1865 Showground Boroughby
- ▶ 1881 Showground The Rink
- ▶ 1887 Showground Millfield
- ▶ 1911 Showground Eastfield
- ▶ 1966 Showground Alwalton
- 2012 Last Three-day show



#### East of England Agricultural Society Achievements

- ▶ 1972 100,000 people attend three-day show
- ▶ 1990 EEAS and the Royal Agricultural Society establish Sacrewell Farm
- 2002 First Marshal Papworth MSc Students arrive in the UK
- 2008 Winter Stock Festival
- 2013 First Kid's Country Food & Farming Day
- ▶ 2019 200<sup>th</sup> Marshal Papworth Student MSc & Short courses
- ► Festival of Hunting & PRFHS continues

- Commercial activities Showground Services (Arena and Events)
- ► Faith events attract 30,000 visitors
- Peterborough City Council Local Plan Adopted
   650 houses on site
- Endurance Estates appointed to promote the development and sale
- Public Consultation underway
