Management of oilseed rape diseases and pests is now scheduled for Wednesday 16th June at the University of Hertfordshire.

This forum will feature work funded by charities and others and provide an opportunity to learn about current developments in disease and pest

The biennial National Forum - 'Growing: Young Minds and New Ideas' is planned for November 15th at Hartpury University and Hartpury College, Gloucestershire.

Full details will be available in the summer newsletter but the programme will include a talk on, and visit to, the Hartpury Agri-Tech Centre (see <u>Agri-Tech</u>). Other speakers will talk on agri-tech issues and also on providing young people with a balanced and informed insight into food production, farming and the environment.

Our biennial Student Forum, to be held at Cranfield University, has been postponed until March 2022. Further information will be available nearer the time.

REVIEW OF AFCP

The Board is currently reviewing all of AFCP's activities including

- Links with broader community: Forums, funding models
- Sharing best practice: coordination and governance.

Following a Zoom meeting with about twenty members last month, there was agreement that communication between members could be enhanced to facilitate co-funding of projects and sharing of best practice. Suggestions included the establishment of a WhatsApp group and/or a protected area of the website, and we will keep you posted of developments on this front.
