## FORTHCOMING AFCP FORUM

### Oilseed rape - Managing diseases and pests

University of Hertfordshire, College Lane Campus Thursday 16 April 2020

There has been considerable support from charities for research on diseases of oilseed rape, particularly stem canker and light leaf spot, and recently five charities have joined together with AHDB to fund a studentship on control of cabbage stem flea beetle.

This Forum, organised with the University of Hertfordshire, provides an opportunity for those interested in this area of research to hear about the outcomes to date and where things are likely to go in the future.

Speakers and poster-presenters from across the industry will be presenting work funded by charities and others, to try and provide a comprehensive account of recent findings.
