# Providing better support for the industry

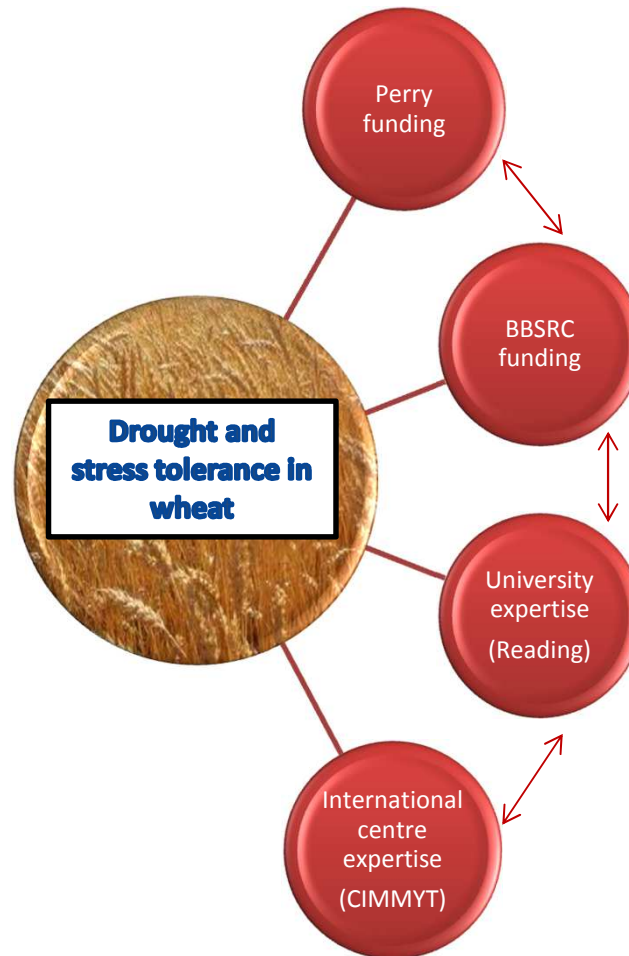
Working with others helps to ensure that we fund relevant projects.

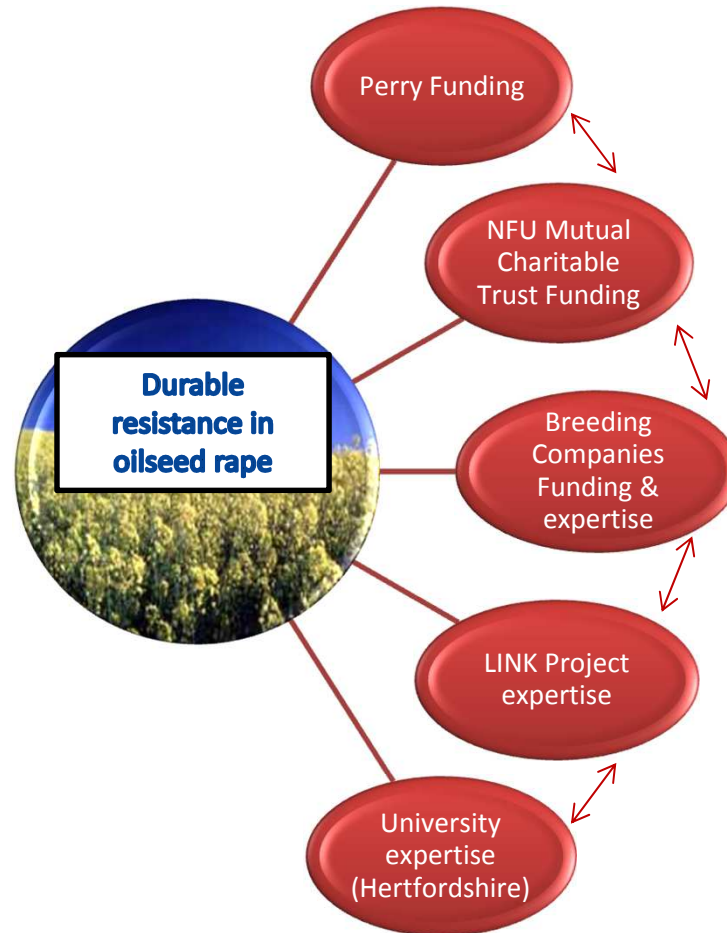

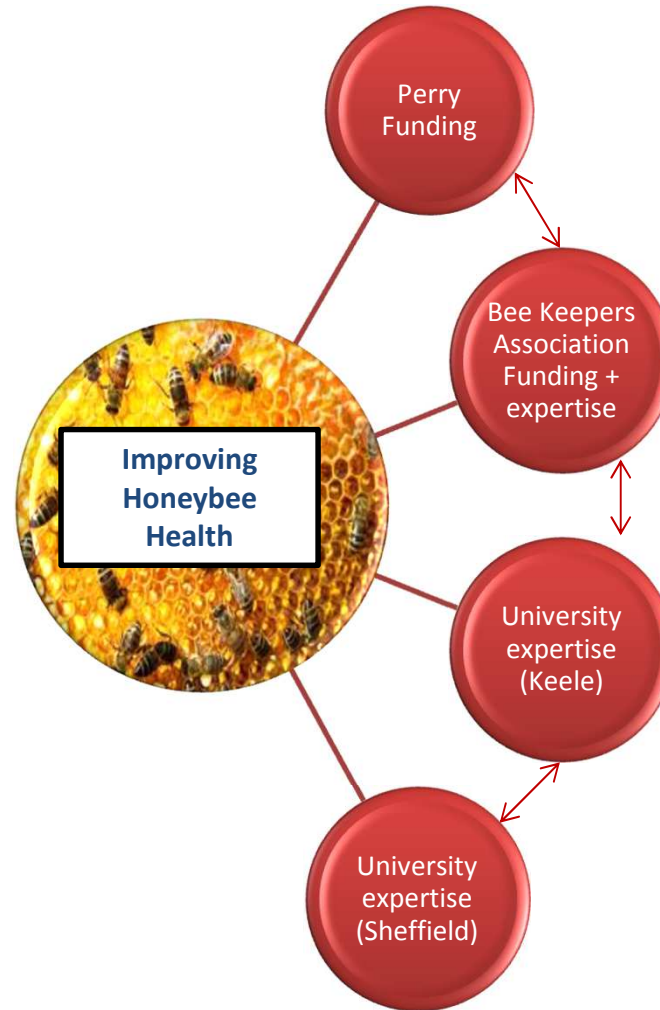

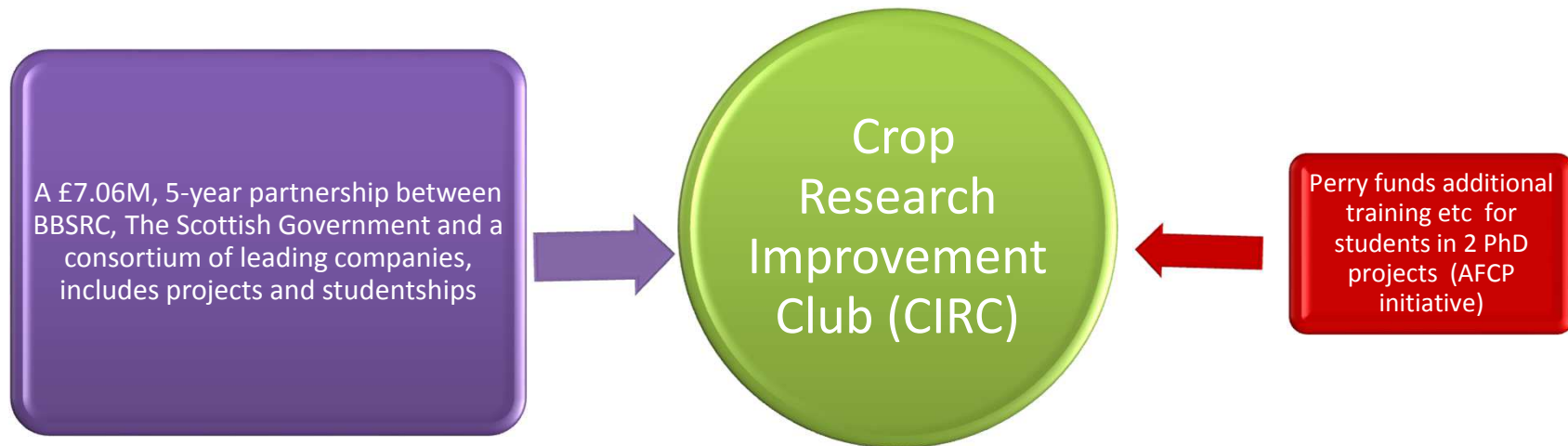
