- New productivity/compliance challenges
- Central funding for applied science funding removed
- Recruitment/retention of business leaders, innovators, technicians and scientists

# **The Starting Point**



#### **Charity features**

- Numerous and diverse
- Often long established
- Tendency to be independent, isolated and conservative
- Individual funding levels increasingly below critical mass

# **Charity Funding**



#### Has some useful features

- Independent of immediate market criteria and politics
- Substantial collective funds
- Can facilitate new initiatives
- An effective lever/supplement
- Can be motivational

# **Charity Funding**



#### Increasing impact and efficiency

- More joint charity funding
- More reference to industry strategies
- Closer liaison with deliverers and other fund sources
- Facilitate effective access
- Share good practice and administration
